EXPLORE THE AREA MARKED ON THE MAP TO FIND THE ANSWER TO EACH QUESTION. THEN USE YOUR ANSWERS TO SOLVE THE MYSTERY PHRASE.



1 Read the sign about orienteering at the entrance of the park. How many orienteering controls are there around Brickworks Park?

2 Read the sign "The Wallsend Brickworks Story". Brickworks began in Newcastle in 1891 and operated for how many years?

3 Nearby, you'll see the remains of the Brickmaking Machine. Look for the plaque placed here during the official opening. What month in 2006 did Brickworks Park open?

4 What is the names of the sculpture by Tim Spellman that is made entirely out of recycled bricks?

5 Visit the new playground at Brickworks Park. What marsupial can you spot on the play equipment?

5 How many swings are at this playground?

6 Walk down to the birdwatching structure. Here you'll spot the Nature's Neighbours sign about the animal life at Brickworks Park. There are drawings of various creatures including this reptile which is drawn sitting on a rock. What is this creature?

7 As you approach the birdwatching structure, look for the orienteering sign marked 108. It is white and what other colour?

8 Examine the birdwatching structure that overlooks the pond in the old brick pit. What shape is the roof? Hint: It can be found on a tree.

9 As you walk back from the birdwatching structure, you'll notice another sign on the left which explains the layers of the brick pit. What type of layers are in the brick pit face?
